## AWOTE increased in November 2016

### ACT (seasonally adjusted<sup>1</sup>)

AWOTE was \$1,744 in November 2016, representing a 0.9 per cent increase from May 2016.

Through the year<sup>2</sup> to November 2016, AWOTE increased by 1.8 per cent.

### National (seasonally adjusted)

AWOTE was \$1,533 in November 2016, representing a 1.1 per cent increase from May 2016.

Through the year to November 2016, AWOTE increased by 2.2 per cent.

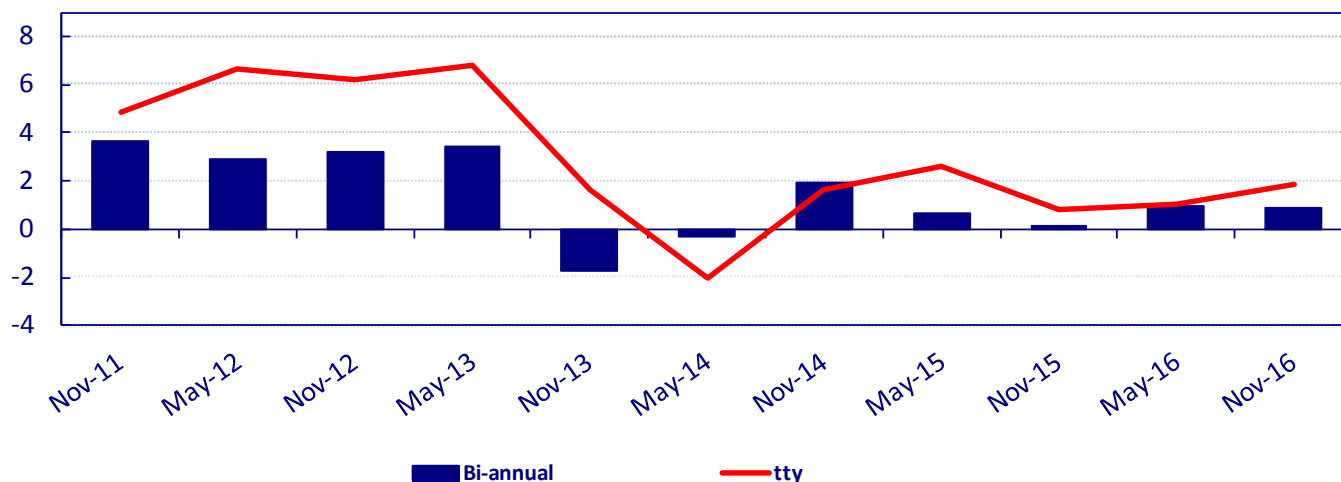

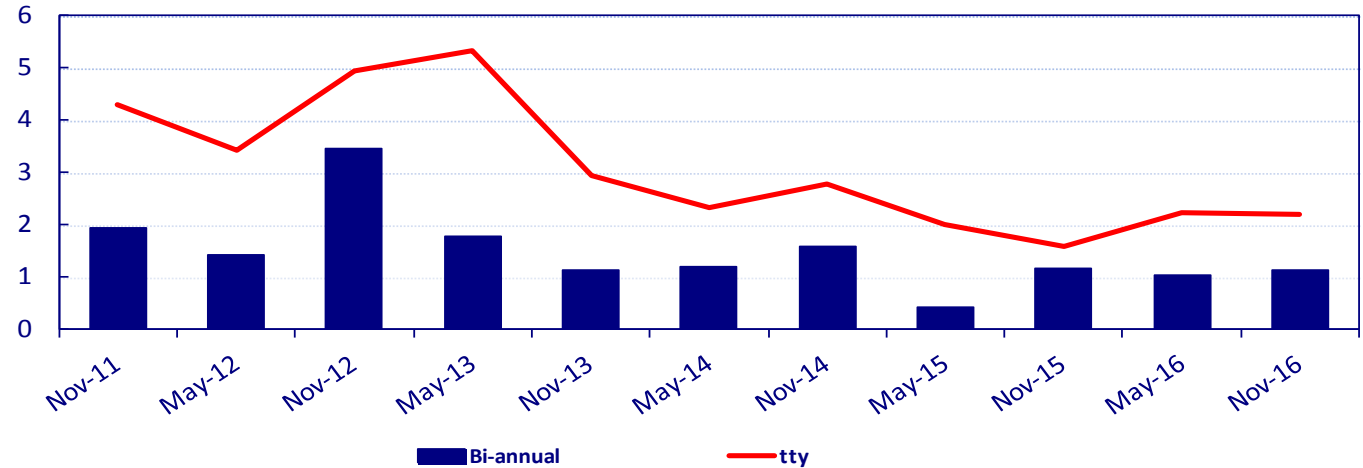

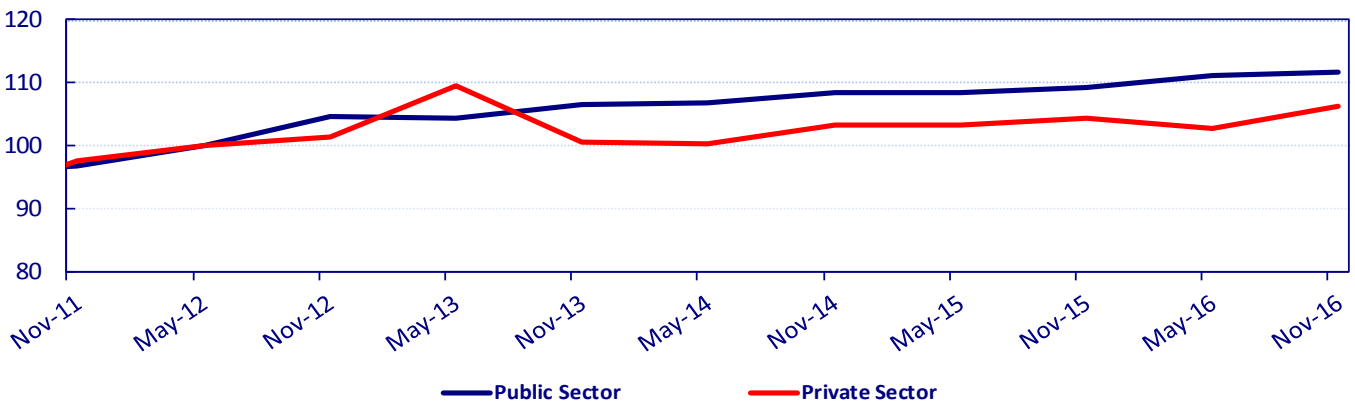

## ACT AWOTE, Public and Private Sectors

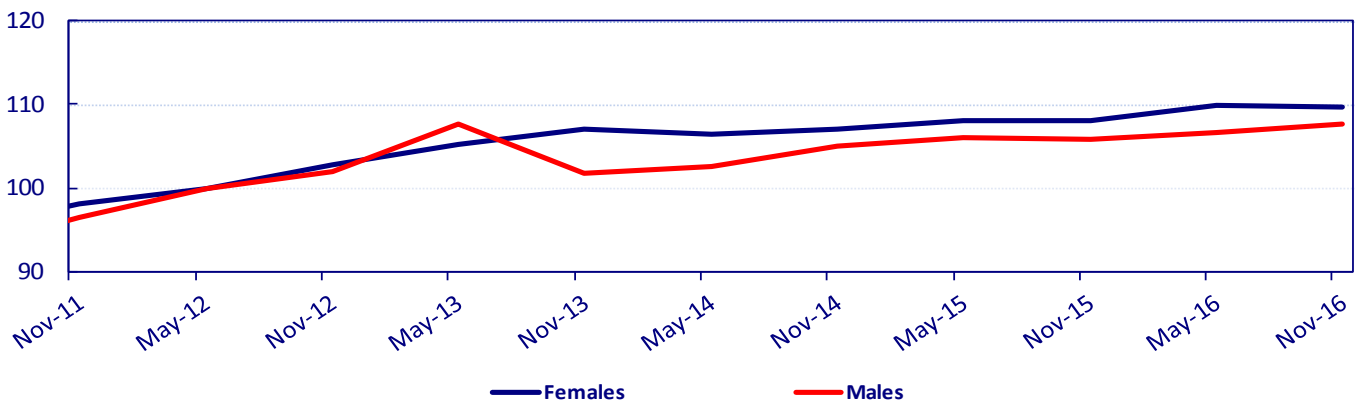
Index

### Definition and Notes

Average weekly ordinary time earnings refer to one week's earnings of employees for the reference period attributable to award, standard or agreed hours of work, excluding overtime. It is calculated before taxation and any other deductions have been made. Adult employees are those employees 21 years of age or over and those employees who, although under 21 years of age, are paid at the full adult rate for their occupation.
